Goal setting, planning and academic tracking are important for academic success, especially in the senior school. As students get older and their assessment workloads increase, good planning and time management, along with a focus on learning, are critical mechanisms of learning needed to ensure success. On Wednesday evening our Year 13 students and their parents met with the Senior Leadership Team and our Senior Deans for academic tracking conversations. These meetings were a dedicated time to unpack each student's current NCEA and University Entrance progress and create a plan of support to ensure that each student can reach their full potential and achieve personal excellence in 2022.

Parents and students at all year levels can track academic progress through a variety of school pathways, including the student and parent portal, bi-weekly engagement reports and live reporting. Data may include teacher comments, assessment data, and attitude scores. This data provides the starting place for learning conversations and goal setting. Questions can be as simple as: what are you learning in class? What assessment or assignments do you have to complete this term? How can we support you with your learning?

Thank you to the students and staff who made this a successful evening.

Click on Finished and the computer will email your interview confirmation to you. If one of your daughter's teachers does not show on the screen, then he/she is fully booked or unavailable.
