Gateway Retail Success

The Covid pandemic has heavily impacted the retail sector, both in many ways, including people's shopping habits and disruptions to the supply chains for retailers stock and merchandise. These changes have led to fewer retailers hosting students for work experience. However, during the July holidays four Year 12 students were able to complete Retail Gateway programmes, two students at Farmers New Lynn, and two at Warehouse Stationery St Lukes, with training provider Service IQ.

In these programmes, students attend the workplace 9am-3pm on weekdays during the school holidays and complete many regular retail tasks, especially shelf stocking and merchandising, as well as checking pricing, creating displays, returning unsold goods to correct locations, and assisting customers with enquiries. They complete theory unit standards relating to communication, teamwork, personal presentation, retail skills, and preventing theft and fraud, earning a total of 23 credits in Unit Standards towards NCEA Level 2.

Students must adhere to store uniform and procedural policies, including health and safety and conduct expectations. This experience gives students the confidence to apply for paid part time jobs when they are ready to do so.

We require immediate payment for any remaining sports charges, please check your daughter's account and if any sports charges remain arrange for payment.


