

Marist College, founded in 1928 by the Marist Sisters, is a Catholic Secondary School for girls situated in Mt Albert, in central Auckland. As a faith-based school, we deliver a curriculum that is built on core values that challenge our young women to live and act as Mary, the Mother of Jesus, would in today’s world.

We currently have a roll of 750 students who strive for excellence in all aspects of their school life. Excellent teachers, staff, school community and learning facilities combined with strong academic success, pastoral care systems and vast cultural and sporting opportunities ensure that our students gain a full and holistic education.

We have strong academic success, offering a curriculum that is recognised internationally. We offer a broad range of subject choice from Years 7 to 13, with a total of 32 subjects available. Acceleration, Scholarship programmes and Gateway opportunities are offered for enrichment and extension. Each year, more than 90% of our students graduate with a Level 3 Certificate and many enrol to study at tertiary level.

Our extra-curricular programmes are extensive. Music programmes include orchestra, band and choir, many of which compete in a variety of regional competitions throughout the year. Our Performing Arts, Drama and Dance programmes develop productions that are performed for audiences both large and small. We also offer over 20 sporting codes ranging from gymnastics through to football.

International Students of all nationalities are warmly welcomed. They do not need to be of Christian faith to attend Marist College. Marist women will graduate well qualified, values driven, competitive, nurturing, community leaders who have a sense of purpose and belonging.



APPLY

- ◆ Complete the international student application form available on our website [Enrolment Form InternationalStudent.pdf](#) including Accommodation information.

EMAIL

- ◆ Email international@maristcollege.school.nz and send the last two years of your school transcripts or marksheets.
- ◆ Write a paragraph about why you want to study at Marist College and email it to international@maristcollege.school.nz

OFFER

- ◆ If approved for entry, you will receive an Offer of Place for your study. This will also include the Invoice for all fees owing.
- ◆ Once the fees are paid, a receipt will be provided
- ◆ You can then apply for your Student Visa to Marist College www.immigration.govt.nz/new-zealand-visas/options/study/explore-student-visas

ARRIVE

- ◆ Marist College staff or your homestay will collect you from the airport
- ◆ You will come to School for orientation, meet your buddy and your timetable will be confirmed.
- ◆ You'll then start classes.





- ◆ **NZ Curriculum**—NCEA is the national qualification framework and information is [here](#).
- ◆ **Academic Progress**—the International Support teacher and other teaching staff will monitor your performance throughout the year and support is offered if you need it
- ◆ **Education Pathways**—the International Director and Careers staff are available to discuss your next steps after finishing school
- ◆ **School Attendance**—Attendance at school is compulsory. Your student visa states that attendance at school is necessary to keep your student visa valid.

Our History and Values

The Marist tradition of education originated in France in the early 19th century with Jeane-Claude Colin and Marcellin Champagnat. Jeanne Marie Chavoine and Jean-Claude Colin founded the Marist Sisters. The Marist Sisters established Marist College in Mt Albert in 1928 with the order still living on-site.

We have a strong Alumni community and many of our girls are daughters of past students. The Marist Sisters and their Christian faith forms the basis of all we do and this includes our core beliefs of family and a caring and supportive school which strives for excellence and developing skills for life.

Marist College Special Character

Pastoral Care at Marist College is underpinned by our Catholic Character and Marist Charism. Students are at the centre of all that we do. We aim to know students personally in order that they fulfill their true potential in all areas: striving to become the people God wants them to be.

Please keep your **Student ID card** with you as your school identification showing your name, photo and date of birth. You can use this in school for photocopying and printing. It can also be used outside of school to get student discounts such as bus and train tickets, movie tickets and in stores that allow student discounts.

An **Academic Report** will be given to you at the end of your study at Marist College.

If you feel unwell, you can tell a teacher and go to see the **School Nurse** in the Wellness Centre. If you would like to talk to someone about a personal issue, there are counsellors at school that you can talk to. You can also talk to your teachers and staff in the International Office.



There are a range of things to do with friends after school or in the weekends such as **playing sport to school events to enjoying activities** across Auckland city. Ask us if you have any queries about what's happening or if there is a particular sport you want to try out.

We will check that your **travel and health insurance** covers you while you're studying with us. There is provision for some costs that can be covered as noted here www.acc.co.nz and the requirements stated as part of your student visa requirements state that you need to have insurance as an international student.

Welcome to Aotearoa New Zealand

Located in the South Pacific, Aotearoa New Zealand is a nation of just over 5 million people with indigenous Māori and European New Zealanders with other cultures from across the Pacific Islands, Asia, Africa and European countries. Māori are the tangata whenua, the indigenous people of Aotearoa and te reo Māori is one of three official languages spoken here including English and sign language.

We are surrounded by unspoilt land and ocean; we have national parks, mountains and modern, vibrant cities. This means you can enjoy what New Zealand has on offer – you can ski, take part in all sorts of outdoor adventures, enjoy an unhurried and relaxed lifestyle, or take part in cultural and national celebrations.

Welcome to Auckland (Tāmaki Makaurau)

The Māori name for Auckland is **Tāmaki Makaurau**, which means ‘a place desired by many’ and it's true – we love Auckland and we are sure you will too.

Most students stay in an approved homestay provider which are families that live near the school or close to transport to get to school. You live in a home with your own bedroom and are part of the family that is looking after you. It is a great way to practice English, see the city, join in with family activities and know people outside of school. When you apply to Marist College, you can apply for Homestay at the same time.

A Designated Caregiver (DCG) is a relative or close family friend known by your parents and committed to staying with you for the duration of your enrolment at Marist College. The DCG will be required to complete the same process for homestay, which is police vetting checks and home visits. Your parent will be required to complete a Designated Caregiver Indemnity Statement.

Your Accommodation

All international students are required to have an onshore support person living in NZ. Parents may nominate who this person is or alternatively, Marist College can arrange this if required. There is an additional fee for providing an onshore support person.

If you are living with one of your parents, it is expected that your parent will stay in NZ while you are at school. We will ask your parent for a copy of their visa and if there are any changes to your living situation, to advise us immediately.

You're on your way to Aotearoa New Zealand!

Closer to your arrival time, information will be sent to you about **orientation** and what to bring with you. You will be welcomed to Marist College officially on your first day of school. Once you've been welcomed, we will have activities and information sessions designed for you to ensure that you are in your correct classes, have insurance and your student visa is recorded, have your student ID photo taken and have the correct uniform.
