Praying the Rosary

The month of October is dedicated to the holy rosary and includes the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. It is one of the best known of all Catholic devotions.

The rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centred on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption with each decade referring to an event in the life of Jesus and Mary. The Mysteries of the rosary give us 'thumbnails' of the life of Christ and his Mother.

The rosary is an incredibly rewarding spiritual practice for people of any age, that developed over many centuries. The first recorded use of the word 'rosary' did not appear until 1597, but the roots of the rosary are found far earlier. The word itself is taken from the Latin 'rosarium' which means 'crown of roses' or 'garland of roses'.

This devotion is like an ancient treasure map that has led countless men and women from all walks of life to the treasures of peace, joy, clarity, and contentment. The best way to celebrate the month is, of course, to pray the rosary. So, find your rosary beads and try it!

Thank you to LNS Whānau for their liturgy on the rosary this week. The rosary is prayed every week at school on Wednesdays, Break 1.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women; and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death.


On 25 September, the Vinnies leaders from Marist College attended the St Vincent de Paul Feast Day Mass at St Patrick's


