

Jean-Claude Colin Feast Day

This week, 15th November, marked the anniversary of Jean-Claude Colin. This very special man was the founder of the Marist Fathers, priests and brothers of the Society of Mary. Born at the close of the 18th century in revolution-torn France, Jean-Claude was convinced that the Blessed Virgin wanted a group of men and women to do her work in the world at a time of turmoil and challenge. With this inspiration he forged the way for a new family of consecrated religious and of laity in the Church - the Marist family, to which we belong.



Under his leadership, as founder and father, Marist missionaries would proclaim Christ's message in Mary's gentle spirit 'on whatever distant shore' to which they were sent. Today Marists throughout the world pray that Jean-Claude Colin will become better known and revered. As his Cause for Beatification is being pursued, they seek graces through his intercession for themselves and the people they serve.

The image here is the 'Official icon of Jean-Claude Colin' - receiving inspiration for the Society of Mary of the Blessed Virgin. Commissioned by the Marist Fathers, it was completed here in New Zealand in 2011 and hangs in the chapel of the Marist General House in Rome.

Apollo - Summer 2022-23 NCEA Level 3 Calculus Programme for Māori and Pacific students

ENGINEERING

The Apollo programme at the University of Auckland Faculty of Engineering is designed to give Māori and Pacific high school students the opportunity to do extra calculus work in a university setting and provide clear pathways into Engineering and the University of Auckland.

For your Year 12's heading into Year 13 in 2023

We intend to run the full 4-week Apollo programme for current Year 12 Māori and Pacific doing Year 12 Math who will be going into Year 13 Calculus. The focus of the summer sessions will be working through NCEA Level 3 differentiation and finishing with an assessment of our work. These students will get a head start in learning differentiation before the school year starts. We will also have the opportunity to introduce students to the University of Auckland as a whole, how it operates, what is expected of students, what the Faculty of Engineering has to offer in our degree programmes, and what the future might be once the degree is finished. The transition from high school to university is difficult for most students, we can help make that transition a much smoother one.
