The Season of Advent

All religions have their important religious celebrations, many originally linked to the cycles of nature. Every year different religions set aside special days or seasons that they consider sacred. The Christian Church has its own special calendar called the 'liturgical year', an annual cycle of seasons and major feasts. Throughout the Church's year the events of Jesus' life, death and Resurrection are remembered and celebrated.

The Church's year begins every year in late November or early December on the First Sunday of Advent and runs through to the Solemnity of Christ the King, the following November. And so, ready or not — this coming Sunday is the first day of Advent! Advent comes from the Latin word Adventus, which signifies a coming. Essentially, Advent is a time for us to prepare for the coming of the birth of Christ.

We have many traditions and customs to help us focus on what really matters. This includes an Advent calendar, lighting candles on an Advent wreath, praying an Advent daily devotional, erecting a Christmas tree, lighting a Christingle, as well as other ways of preparing for Christmas, such as setting up Christmas decorations and of course attending Mass.

One of the lovely things we do here at the college is support the annual Gift Giving Programme for Monte Cecilia – this is just one example of practical

ways to demonstrate the purposeful reflection of the meaning of Christmas. Please see the notice for futher details – it is a wonderful way to get into the spirit of the season.
