

Congratulations to Olivia Jiang. Olivia competed at Lake Taupo Open Water Championships from the 14th to 15th of January. She swam the 2.5 km on the first day, followed by the 5km on the second. In her age group(12-14), she came 3rd on the 5k and 7th on the 2.5k. It was her first



time swimming the 5k in the open water and she swam a time of 1.21.39. Well done Olivia!

Congratulations to Terina Taia. Terina qualified to represent the AROCA Region in both V1 (singles) for 500m sprint and 250m dash. She placed 6th overall from 27 entries in the 500m sprint and 5th from 12 entries for the 250m dash. Our Nationals are based on club representation from around New Zealand. Terina is currently paddling for Akarana. Her J19 team results were: J19 Women 1000m turns - 2023 National Champions; J19 Women 500m sprint - Silver; J19 Women 12 500m sprint - Silver.
