As we near the end of Term 1, many of our junior and senior students have been working diligently on assessments to show their understanding of the teaching and learning that has taken place in class. It has been wonderful to see students stretch and grow themselves through a variety of tasks such as oral presentations, in-class investigations and written responses.

There is no one-size-fits-all approach when learning how to effectively study and prepare for internal assessment. Every student has different abilities and ways of engaging with the information they learn in class, so it is important that your daughter determines what works best for her. Techniques such as mind maps and flash cards, completing practice exams or explaining a key concept to someone else at home, can all be effective ways to revise key information in preparation for assessment. To support our students to achieve their best, we are excited to welcome the return of CoLab – our after-school study sessions. Different members of staff and the student Academic Committee will be providing a quiet space in the library where students can study from 3:10 - 4:30pm on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Students attending CoLab will have teachers and peers on hand to assist and provide support. We encourage all our students to make use of this space and the expertise of staff when they need it.

EY STEM App

Marist College is participating in the EY STEM App program. The EY STEM App is a free gamified mobile app, with rewards, that aims to spark interest, inspire, and empower the next generation of girls into STEM subjects and careers.

With an incentivised learning model, girls earn points as they complete learning activities such as reading an article, interviewing members of their community, completing an experiment, or watching a video. As they build up points, girls can redeem various rewards such as:

- Digital vouchers to be spent across selected retailers
- Mentoring workshops provided by EY teams (topics scheduled include Future of Work, Day in the life of a Consultant and Women in Leadership)
