Over the past year we have been looking for ways to improve our communication and make all information more accessible for staff, students, and parents. The introduction of SchoolBridge has allowed us to provide a platform to effectively communicate all school information from one simple to use app.

SchoolBridge is now our fastest and most direct communication method to contact you with important alerts, including emergencies such as lockdowns or evacuations. It includes options for submitting absences or requesting an exit pass, access to our school calendars and daily notices, plus direct access to our Parent Portal to view or update student details, access to attendance records, NCEA credits and much more. You can access it from any device, switch between multiple student accounts, view reports, pay school contributions and read our newsletter all from one dashboard.

Year 10 NCEA Numeracy Standard


On Thursday, 15th June our Year 10 students will have their first opportunity to sit the NCEA Numeracy Standard. This standard becomes a mandatory co-requisite to NCEA from 2024 onwards. Sitting this standard in 2023 will give our Year 10 students the opportunity to become familiar with the format and content, along with the possibility of entering Year 11 with this aspect of NCEA already achieved.

Our Mathematics Department is working hard to prepare students for the assessment. We encourage our Year 10 students to do their best and strive for personal excellence, but to also remember that they will be provided with multiple opportunities to sit the Numeracy assessment as they move through their senior years of learning at Marist College.

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

First Sunday after Pentecost

"In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit"— these are words we



use every time we pray the Sign of the Cross. Sometimes, we say this prayer without even thinking. The prayer expresses the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity, that God reveals himself in Three Persons: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Our Year 11s have recently completed their work on The Trinity – a key doctrine and central mystery to Christian faith and life.

This topic forms part of the Understanding Faith Curriculum and aims to increase their awareness of theology as 'faith seeking understanding'. Overall, a tricky concept, but our faith helps us believe and accept God's Revelation, even when we do not fully understand these things with our rational minds. That is what we mean by the word mystery: it is something that can only be known through God's Revelation. The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the source of all the mysteries of our faith.

Young, Free and Pacific Conference

10 Pasifika students in Year 11 were able to attend the Young, Free and Pacific (YFP) conference held at Mangere Arts Centre. Organised by Pasefika Proud, with sponsorship from the Ministry for Pacific Peoples, YFP is an inspirational conference for young Pasifika people spread over two days with separate events for girls and boys. Students hear from Pacific community leaders, engage in creative workshops and talanoa with like-minded rangatahi and panel experts about the challenges they face.

At the YFP conference we had a few speakers come in and talk about their experience of being Pasifika. How their cultural ways flowed into their lives with school, work, aiga (family) and in everything they did. I learnt from some of the guest speakers that no matter what colour, shape, size, or race you are, you have every right to do anything you want. Even if the whole world is telling us that we are not good enough to achieve our goals, we should never step down. We have to keep going in life, especially during those hard times, because those are obstacles and challenges given to us to see if we are worthy enough. We then did workshops in music, spoken word, dance, and drama. All had an element of culture and voice involved. Pacific Health Wayfinders Year 12 Academic Prep day
