#### Read by Faith:

You know who else was a tax collector? Matthew. Saint Matthew. The Apostle. The Gospel writer. One of Jesus' closest friends. Matthew was born in Galilee, which is a really nice, fancy fishing town. Tax collectors were disliked in Jesus' day. If people owed the King two silver coins, the tax collectors would go and make them pay, BUT they would charge them three



silver coins... and keep one themself. Sneaky and dishonest behaviour like this is what made people not trust them. So why on earth would Jesus include a tax collector as one of his right-hand men? Why would Jesus want to be seen to be hanging out with dishonest thieves? Jesus was a leader by example, He also walked the talk, and showed people how to live good lives - not just telling them what to do but showing them. By including a tax collector in his squad, Jesus sends a message: a message of how everyone should be treated with kindness and forgiveness; how everyone should be included, and how everyone deserves a second chance.


