Ki o rahi Tournament

Ki o rahi is a Māori invasion game played between 2 teams. Kīoma score by touching Pou/s with the Kī (for potential points) then running the Kī through Te Roto and placing it down in Pawero to convert pou touches into points. Kīoma stop the other team, Taniwha.

Taniwha score by hitting the Tupu with the Kī. Kīoma will have Kaitiaki (guardians) around the Tupu to stop Taniwha from hitting the Tupu. Depending on which variation is being played, Taniwha must stop Kīoma from scoring by either touching, 2 handed touch, ripping the tag or tackling them in the appropriate area.

All classes brought great energy and competition. 9R were the winners on the day, with 9T in 2nd, 9M in 3rd. 9S won the fair play award.
