## Year 10 Drama fight workshop

Year 10 Drama students were taught some sword fighting techniques for their upcoming drama assessment. Alexander from the New Zealand Stage and Screen Combat School took students through a series of movements with particular emphasis on safety. He taught students that intense focus is required to create an engaging and accurate fight scene. Some students will perform a fight scene from Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet. Charlie understood from the workshop that, "Nowadays you would be close to your opponent, within punching range but in Elizabethan times you had to keep away from your enemy, the distance of a rapier."

Students learned how to move with the swords and found that the rapiers/swords were, "Really heavy" said Rishmikaa. "Being called a liar" they discovered, was one of the greatest insults a person could receive in Shakespeare's time. Students will apply this new knowledge and more as they make decisions about acting techniques to communicate the feelings and objectives of their characters and the writer's intent. Gregory (and others) will remember his/her/their 'swashing blow' but now in an informed, entertaining, and safe manner.



#### MONTE CECILIA EGG DONATIONS


