From the Principal

Last week, Dr Houliston and I had the opportunity to visit two of our Marist Sisters' Colleges and meet the Marist Sisters in Sydney. This visit allowed us to build connections with two schools that share our Catholic charism and to celebrate the feast day of Jean Marie Chavoin, the founder of the Marist Sisters, with Cerdon College at their school Mass.

Both Marist Sisters' College Woolwich and Cerdon College share our Marist values and deliver high-quality education for girls. While school structures and leadership models varied, the underlying feeling of being Marist was undeniable. In meeting the different leadership teams, we were introduced to the different ways each school lives out their Marist values and how they ensure these values are visible within the school. We learned that schools in Australia face similar challenges to ours, including absenteeism, staffing shortages, a recession, and students navigating the online world. Both schools are focused on shaping strong Catholic future leaders. We would like to thank their Senior Leadership Teams for welcoming us so warmly to their colleges.

Meeting and sharing a meal after mass with the Marist Sisters was the highlight of the trip. Each Sister was enthusiastic and genuinely happy to meet us. Being in their presence brought a sense of familiarity and warmth. They spoke fondly of their experiences teaching in New Zealand or visiting the New Zealand based Sisters, and we discussed the connections between our New Zealand and Australian schools. It was wonderful to talk with such inspirational women who have dedicated their lives to empowering girls through Catholic education. We came away feeling very blessed to have the support and love of our own Marist Sisters onsite at our kura.

As we start planning for 2025 and beyond, we will be using the learning for this trip to shape our annual goals and review our strategic direction.

The Nathaniel Centre, Bioethics Education, and The National Centre for Religious Studies wish to understand young people's thinking about some significant issues of our times. To do this, they are inviting Year 13 students from across the country to take part in a short, anonymous online survey called "What Is Your Stand?" Each question in the survey outlines a particular issue and asks the student where they stand on this issue. They are then asked to provide reasons for their stance. The results will provide insights into the ways that young adults are responding to the world in which they find themselves at a time that they are preparing to enter the workforce, a trade or tertiary education. The survey is the third phase of a larger project begun in 2019 in which the researchers continue to explore how young people are conceptualising and navigating the ethical challenges with which they are confronted. International Students

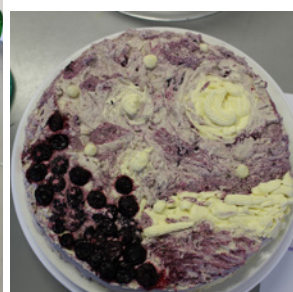
