
Marist College Special Character

The homestay families are all vetted and approved by Marist College to make sure that the family you live with is kind, caring and will look after you as their own daughter. Families can be made up with different sizes and locations. Some families will have students at Marist College or will have done so previously. We will match families with students as much as we can as there are also dietary or other requests as "can I live in a home with a dog please"! You will have your own bedroom with storage and a study desk and three meals a day, plus snacks.











Learning Outside the Classroom
