
# Seeing a new perspective

# Physio Update

Kia Ora Marist College Students, Families and Staff

It's a very busy winter sports season and the <u>Marist College Physio clinic</u> is often booked out on the Monday and Wednesday mornings!

#### **Did Not Attend without Notification**

Please ensure that if you cannot attend an appointment for any reason, you give me notice to avoid a DNA invoice being sent.

We are fully booked with a waiting list at times, so its great to ensure everyone can get in to see me.

#### **Appointment fees**

ACC and Non Insurer fees are charged at the Marist College clinic. If finances are a barrier please contact me to discuss. Access to the physio clinic is important.

#### **Sports Taping**

I am happy to do sports taping when needed, but as a Physio I need to assess and treat/educate about injury prevention and recovery. Often strength, conditioning, load management and communication with Sports team management and PE department is needed. It is best to book in for a physio appointment to assess thoroughly. I am also happy to teach you how to tape common injuries and advise about more effective solutions eg braces if appropriate. If your team or daughter wants taping - please contact me to discuss further.

#### Additional Items

Sometimes there is a clinical need for therapeutic equipment to be used for rehab exercises eg TheraBand, which has a small cost. I will email the parent or guardian to discuss and get permission before supplying to students.

#### **Drop Ins/ Quick Chats**

I am happy to have a free/no fees quick chat to anyone who wants to ask a question or raise a concern. I will email Parent or Guardian to let them know if there is a recommendation for a physio appointment.




