## From the Deputy Principal

Catholic School for Girls, Years 7 to 13

At Matariki we remember those in our whanau who have passed on, we are thankful for what we have, and we look forward to the promise of the future.

The theme for Matariki this year is "inclusion, embracing diversity and celebrating Matariki together". It asks us to embrace the different traditions, stars and tikanga around celebrating the Māori New Year. At Marist College we celebrated with our Hikoi to Ōwairaka/Mt Albert (Te Ahi-Kāa-Rakataura). It was wonderful to mark the beginning of the Māori New Year together as a community with karakia and waiata. The hikoi was followed by kai in the staffroom and a wonderful assembly which showcased the talents of our Kapa Haka ropū. A massive thank you to our whanau who planned and prepared breakfast for all of us.

At our assembly we also had the opportunity to celebrate the impressive achievement of Brydie Mitchell (Year 9) who competed in Ngā Manu Korero on Friday last week. Brydie gave a moving speech on the topic "Help me find my place". She spoke powerfully, with conviction, and was awarded 'Best Female Speaker' in the Ta Turi Kara Junior English category; and The Sir Turi Carroll Trophy for 'Best Overall Junior Speaker' (in the Junior English category for Tāmaki Makaurau). We are so proud of Brydie and look forward to seeing her compete in the Ngā Manu Korero national finals later in the year.

The diversity and unity of Marist College was also on show at a range of events over the last week:

- A committed group of junior and senior students competed in the Bollywood Showdown -New Zealand's biggest Indian High School dance competition. This group is choreographed by the students themselves, and their passion and enthusiasm for their culture was evident in their performance.
- We also celebrated the Year 12 and 13 School Ball at Alexandra Park where there was plenty of dancing, laughter and photos to be had.
- Our staff and students took part in the Kahui Ako Pasifika Mass at St Joseph's Grey Lynn. It was a beautiful celebration of the many Pacific cultures in our Kāhui Ako schools. I would like to acknowledge the staff who have consistently made the mass such a special event over the years.
- · We awarded one of the oldest cups in the school at our Singing Cup competition. The competition was fierce and a reflection of the talent at Marist College. Congratulations to Star Lam (Intermediate), Felicia Tibbles (Junior) and Svetlana Pritchard (Senior) who won each of their respective categories.

Of course, none of these opportunities would be available to our students without the tireless mahi of our staff and whānau who work to organise events and support our students.

### The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Every year on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday we celebrate the Holy Eucharist in the Catholic Church. This most important liturgical event is in essence the belief that during the Consecration time at Mass the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest.

The Gospel account on Sunday is about the miracle of the loaves and fish which prefigures the blessing of the Eucharist (Lk 9: 11-17). Jesus instituted the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist in the Last Supper, and since then, at every Catholic Mass, Jesus is truly present in the Most Holy Eucharist.

Our Sacramental students are currently learning about the great significance of the Holy Eucharist, and they will receive first Holy



Communion in our Marist Day Mass in Term Three.

We pray in a special way for all of them and, as a Catholic School community, that we will continue to deepen our understanding and love of the Holy Eucharist.


#### Some Auckland speed limits are changing
