At least 7 reasons to join Marist College:

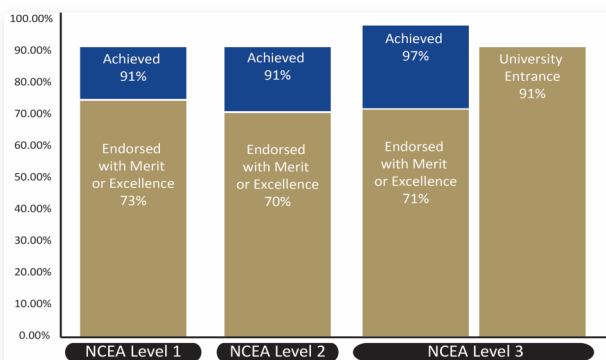
- You will have a **buddy** when you arrive.

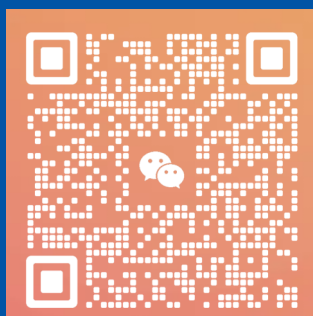
